There is a turned top finial on the top of the column support. The Screen is fully adjustable with two brack locking collars that can slide up and down the main support column. The back of the screen still has the fine red silk trim intact and undisturbed. The screen is crafted to a high standard and is has a french ploished finish with original patina.
