Portrait Of Lieutenant Maximilian Dalison Signed and dated upper right "William Carter '87" - A fine portrait of this Scots Guards officer, painted two years after his death, by William Carter in a very bravura manner...short distinct brush marks...a real painterly enjoyment in the medium. - ABOUT THE ARTIST WILLIAM CARTER RBA, RP (1863-1939). Born in Swaffham, Norfolk and brother of the famous Egyptologist Howard Carter, who discovered of Tutankhamun's tomb. - William studied at the Royal Academy, winning many awards. He exhibited 40 times at the RA, and at the RHA, SBA, GG, NWG, RP and abroad. Elected to the Royal Society of British Artists in 1884, and Royal Society of Portrait Painters in 1915. He had a very successful society portrait practice. He lived at Swaffham and at London. - BROTHER HOWARD CARTER Howard Carter was born on May 9, 1874, in Kensington, London. His father Samuel Carter was a successful artist. Howard was a sickly child, and was sent to live with his aunts in Norfolk. He had private home schooling, and had an artistic streak from an early age. When his father painted a portrait of a well-known Egyptologist, the young Howard's interest was sparke...

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
