The hallmarked silver neck with reeded decorations, the jar comes with a Regency period mustard spoon, dated London 1818 and made by Thomas Freeth. The matching pepper pot glass bottle with identical cut glass decorations, the pierced pull-off silver lid mounted on a fully hallmarked silver neck.
