There is a matching frosted glass underplate, also with a cut star. The lid is scalloped and decorated with engraved acanthus leaves. There is a seated cow finial and a charming armorial of a rampant lion to the front. This superior piece also has the distinction of being by one of the great names in 19th Century silver, the Barnard Family. A rare and usable item of silver and glass tableware.
