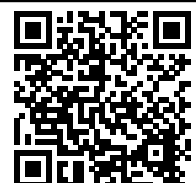
Description

A rare Kakiemon porcelain water dropper, Edo Period, c. 1680. Modelled as Daikoku, The God of Good Fortune, standing upon two large bales of rice and wearing a broad smile. He has a large sack over his left shoulder, whilst holding his mallet in his right hand. His robes are enamelled with textile motifs, in typical Kakiemon style. The flat base with lightly impressed gauze pattern. Height - 8 cm, 3 1/8". Width - 5.1 cm, 2". Depth - 5.1 cm, 2". Condition - Firing cracks and typical wear to the enamels. No restoration.
