Description

A fine and large Japanese Imari bowl, late 17th Century, Genroku Period (1688 - 1704). Decorated in iron-red, yellow, green, light blue, aubergine and black enamels, and gilt on underglaze blue, the interior with a central roundel containing fish swimming amongst weeds, surrounded by a broad band of chrysanthemum and meander design. A further textile motif to the rim. The exterior with four shaped panels containing pine and prunus trees, divided by flowering plants on a continuous cell net motif, in iron red, above a lappet motif. Having a footrim, with an underglaze blue whorl design. Underglaze blue concentric circles to the base, within an unglazed foot rim. Diameter - 36 cm, 14 1/4". Height - 18 cm, 7 1/8". Condition - Typical minor wear to the enamel and the gilding. No damage. No restoration.
