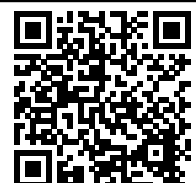
Early C19th William IV period rosewood library table of bold design and proportions. Figured rosewood free-standing rectangular library table fitted with 2 frieze drawers. Raised on columnar end supports with richly-carved scrolling acanthus leaf collars onto a flattened platform end with boldly-carved lion's paw feet with claw detail. The ends united by a central carved stretcher of circular form. The frieze flitted with 2 full-length drawers to one side. The opposing frieze with mirrored design, both sides centred by a stylised carved block of acanthus leaves. The well-figured rosewood top with a good rich patina and colour and original polished finish. The outline of the rectangular top with gently swept rounded corners. The whole raised on original inset brass wheel castors beneath the carved feet. A boldly-carved exuberant table of top quality in excellent original condition. H 29" W 54" D 26" England c.1830
