Description

An extremely rare Newcastle silver tankard dating from the 18th Century. This superb piece is of baluster shape, with a raised foot. The capacity is a pint and the gauge of the silver is good. There are faint 'pricked' initials to the handle outer and an elongated 'kick' to the bottom of the handle. There is a later monogram to the front and fine hallmarks including the rare and sought after incuse duty mark, struck only in 1784/5. Silver from this period and assayed in Newcastle is extremely difficult to find, as mostly flatware prevails. A wonderful collector's piece.

The foot has a very slight flattening to the rim and the body, all commensurate with age and use. Hallmarks :- Superbly clear and readable. Repeat Maker's mark to handle.
