This is a very rare surviving example of a George III Scottish silver mustard pot. Dated Edinburgh 1791, it bears the marks of Matthew Crow. Of traditional oval form, the sides pierced with vertical slats within prick-dot borders. The navette shaped cartouche on one side engraved with a set of contemporary script initials. One the other side vacant. The domed cover with urn finial and matching bright-cut decorations. Unusual plain flat scroll handle. Fitted with a blue glass liner. Hallmarks: MC for Matthew Crow (double struck) Duty Mark. Edinburgh Assay Mark Thistle. Date letter "L" for 1791. Condition: Very good No dings or dents. Liner in perfect condition. Good hinge.
