An early 19th century oak document box belonging to Henry Hanmer, having brass drop handles to either side, and a blue baize interior. The name 'Henry Hanmer' is carved into the top. No key present. Lieutenant-Colonel Henry Hanmer, KH DL was an English Tory politician who sat in the House of Commons from 1831 to 1837. He became a cornet in the Royal Horse Guards in 1808 and in 1813 was Aide-de-camp to Sir Rowland Hill at Pampeluna and at the Battle of Vitoria. He reached the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. He was a J.P. and Deputy Lieutenant for Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Berkshire. Item Ref; M-1565 . DIMENSIONS: Height – 30cm / Width – 63cm / Depth – 43cm .
