K0394 Stylish bentwood coat stand with beehive finial to the top, six scrolled hat and coat hooks and turned column terminating in four downswept legs. This antique coat stand is in excellent home ready condition. The hall stand bear a label Z P M Radomsko. c1940 Michael Thonet (2 July 1796 – 3 March 1871) was a German-Austrian cabinet maker, known for the invention of bentwood furniture. He received a bronze medal at The Great exhibition of London in 1851 and at the next World's Fair, Exposition Universelle in Paris 1855, he was awarded the silver medal. In 1856 Thonet Brothers expanded with a furniture factory in Korycany and in the next years, five more Central European production sites were established in Bystrice pod Hostýnem, Velké Uherce, Vsetín, Halenkov and Radomsko in 1880.
