The glass bottle is of clear glass, with double bands of hobnail cutting, alternating with facet cutting. The silver spoon is gilded and has a cut glass ball finial. The bottle would have been for cayenne pepper, a condiment served at the table in the 18th/19th Century. A lovely collector's piece. Dimensions below.
