A fabulous set of six early 18th Century silver tablespoons from the reign of George II. These handsome and practical examples are in the sought after Hanoverian pattern and have a handsome rat-tail to the reverse of each bowl. To the top of the shank is a handsome engraved armorial. Flatware is rather scarce nowadays due to the great losses, caused by the unscrupulous melting of antique silver for scrap. Therefore a complete and matching set of four, from this early in the 18th Century is a rare find. Dimensions below.
