This is a stunning antique English Victorian silver plated nut dish or sweet dish, by the silversmith William Hutton & Sons of Sheffield with the Crossarrows mark and dated C 1880. It features a fabulous shell embossed body and has a squirell eating a nut whilst balanced on one end, the shell is raised on a round pedestal base. Dimensions in cm: Height 17 x Width 26 x Depth 23 Dimensions in inches: Height 7 inches x Width 10 inches x Depth 9 inches William Hutton & Sons - the firm was established in Birmingham by William Hutton in 1800 and transferred in Sheffield in 1832 where the firm was active as manufacturing silversmiths and platers at 27 High Street (140-146 West Street from 1886). After his death the business was continued under the same style by the founder's son William Carr Hutton until 1864, when the name was changed to William Hutton & Son. This was a partnership of William Carr Hutton and his youngest son Herbert Hutton (senior, born 1843). William Carr Hutton died in 1865 and c. 1870 Herbert Hutton Sr. was joined by his...

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
