Description

Pair of Studies of Nude Females. Dating to the mid 20th Century, this nude study was drawn by Derek Latymer-Sayer who studied at 'The Chelsea School of Art' under Henry Moore. Composed using pastel and brown wash on paper. This studies are signed and framed. 84 x 58 cm Sayer had a distinguished start to his career, having studied at the Chelsea School of Art in the early 1930s under Graham Sutherland and Henry Moore. In 1936 he founded the Mousehole Group Art School in Cornwall with fellow painters George Lamborn and Guy Allen, and for the next few years he exhibited at a number of small local galleries, while also executing commercial advertising work for major companies such as Shell Oil. The 1940s and 50s were a period of widespread travelling, teaching and experimentation for Sayer, as he founded the Army Art Centre in 1945, worked in the South of France in 1949 and displayed works at the Leicester, Redfern and Winton Galleries across the 1950s. In 1966, he took up the helm as the Head of Art at the Chelsea Westminster Adult Education Institute, a position he held until his retirement in 1982. The majority of the works in our collection date from later in this perio...

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
