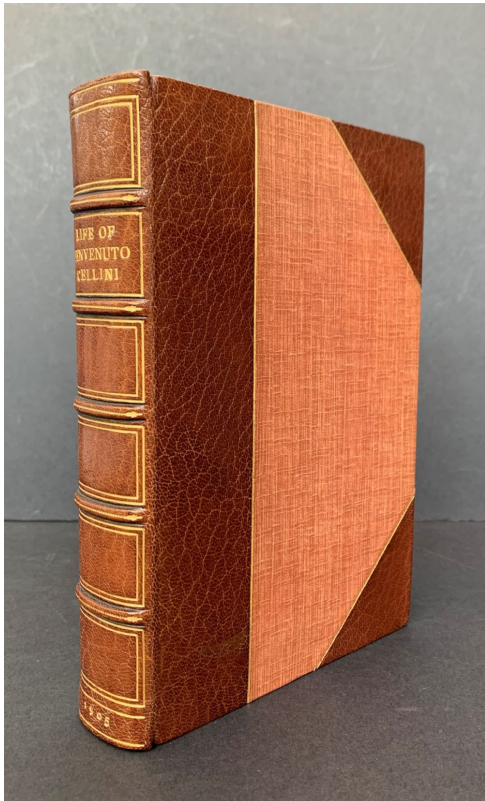

Description

Benvenuto Cellini, (1500 Florence – 1571 Florence), was an Italian goldsmith, sculptor, draftsman and artist who also wrote poetry and a famous autobiography which because of the lively account of himself and his period made him one of the most picturesque figures of the Renaissance. He is one of the most important artists of Mannerism and is remembered for his skill in such pieces as the Cellini Salt Cellar, and Perseus with the head of Medusa. The Life of Benvenuto Cellini written by himself and translated in-to English by John Addington Symonds (1840-1893) an English poet, literary critic and cultural historian known for his work on the renaissance as well as numerous biographies of writers and artists. Finely bound by Hatchards of London in brown crushed half morocco with cloth boards. The gilt decorated spine is arranged as 6 compartments by 5 raised bands and the top page edges are gilt.
