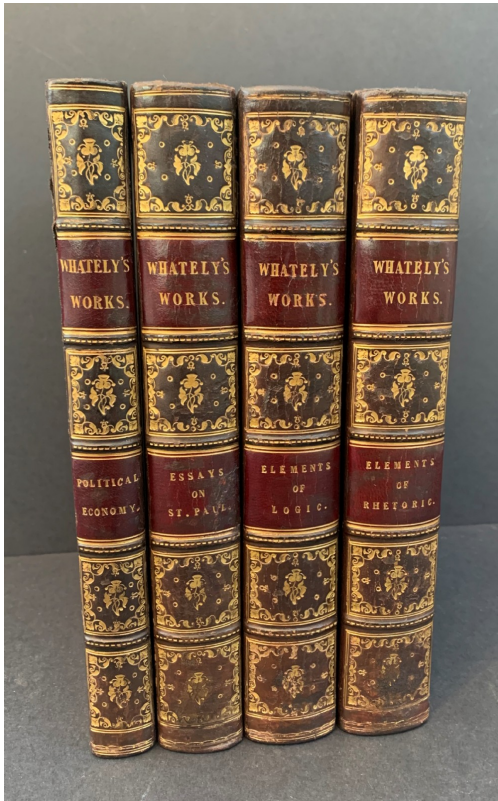

Richard Whately (1787-1863) was an English academic, rhetorician, logician, philosopher, economist and theologian who also served as Arch Bishop of Dublin for the Church of Ireland. He was a prolific and combative author over a wide range of topics, a flamboyant character and one of the first reviewers to recognise the talents of Jane Austen. A uniformly bound selection of four of Whately's works, in various editions, published by B Fellowes of London, as follows:- Introductory Lectures on Political Economy, second edition, published 1832. Essays (Second Series) on some of the difficulties in the writings of the Apostle Paul, fourth edition, revised, published 1837.
