Technical Description An exceptionally rare 19th century Nailsea cranberry glass decanter. It has its original hollow cone stopper with three clear applied neck rings. White pulled feather decoration with a large clear cushion knob above a clear hexagonal cut foot which has a polished pontil. **Comments** We can't emphasize enough just how rare this decanter is. We have never seen another in over 20 years and you won't find one online. A cranberry nailsea wine carafe with the same design and clear neck rings and a few white nailsea carafes and a single decanter in 2018 are the only comparisons. **Date & Origin** England, c1870. Period of Victoria. **Condition** Excellent, age-related wear as shown. No chips, cracks or restoration, clean and clear internally. **Dimensions** Height: 36 cm (including stopper) Diameter: 12cm **Historical Relevance** John D.
