A scarce early 19th Century pattern, often confused with fiddle, thread & shell, these are a fine set of four George IV silver teaspoons. These lovely examples are in the rare fiddle, thread and husk pattern and are double struck (pattern to front and back). There are no engraved monograms or initials. Flatware is rather scarce nowadays due to the great losses, caused by the unscrupulous melting of antique silver for scrap. Therefore a matching set of four, in a sought after pattern is a rare find.
