Signed J B Russell in red in the bottom corner by the known Scottish artist A fine example of his work. Artist biography James Russell 1867-1956, painted under the name 'J B Russell'. He was born in Edinburgh and following the death of his mother from smallpox, his father, John Bucknell Russell, took the family to an island in the Forth to escape the plague. It was around this time that his father was commissioned by the Duke of Richmond and Gordon to go to Fochabers, Morayshire, in the North of Scotland, to carve in wood and paint every salmon over the weight of forty pounds caught in the River Spey. James followed in his father's footsteps as an artist and became practiced in the elaborate task of painting scales onto carved fish....
