It is of shallow circular form with trailing fruiting vine decorations and snake ring handle. Both base and side hallmarked. Hallmarks: Head of Socrates, also known as "Le vieillard", for silver items hallmarked between 1819 and 1938. Located on the side, a little faint but identifiable.
