A full sized silver cased tape measure of exceptional quality and dating from the elegant Edwardian era. The magnificent casing is of outstanding gauge silver with engine turned pattern throughout. The central pivot opens via a recessed button and there is an engraved pair of dates '1886 1911' to the central cartouche. The tape itself is 40 feet in length and is printed with both imperial measurements and chains/poles to the reverse. It was sold at Christies Auction house in 2010 and the original auction ticket gives the provenance that it was the property of the Spencer Family of Althorp - Princess Diana's ancestors. A unique and very desirable item, relating to several areas of interest. Dimensions below.
