Description

A superb example of a solid sterling silver soup tureen and cover. It has an oval bellied form with gadrooned and ribbed rim standing on an oval foot with twin reeded handles. The lid has a beautiful pomegranate and leaf finial. The lid and base are engraved with small armorial crests. One is a hand holding a crescent moon and the other is a unicorn above a scroll with latin motto. The quality is absolutely superb and it weighs approximately 2140g. It is stamped on the base with four maker's marks for John Parker I & Edward Wakelin. The lid and base are also both engraved "No.2" and there is a stamped "2" on the lid. The base is also marked "75=11". There are no traditional hallmarks, only the maker's stamps but it has been tested as sterling silver. The makers mark is registered to London 1761 - 1774. It is in excellent condition for its age. There are a few minor surface marks and signs of age and use but no major damages and it displays beautifully. It has been gently cleaned and polished and is ready for use. The best description comes from the photos so please look at them all carefully and if you have any questions just ask.
