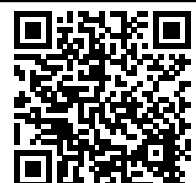
French 8-day brass Striking Carriage Clock by the famous Parisian clockmaker Henri Jacot. Housed in a Corniche case, the movement is numbered 3236, which is quite an early serial number. The 8-day movement retains its original platform lever escapement, striking hours and half-hours on a gong. The enamelled dial displays both Roman and Arabic numerals with diamond quarter markers and dots for minutes. Blued steel spade hands. Comes with numbered key (not original). About the Clock Maker: Henri JACOT was one of the great Parisian Carriage Clock makers of the 19th century. His father (also Henri) founded the business. He developed his own tools and machinery so as to be able to make some of his own components, as well as relying on outsourced suppliers. The quality and beauty of his workmanship helped make his clocks some of the most highly sought-after carriage clocks on the market. Sold in full working order - Guaranteed for 12 months.
