This delightful George III silver caddy spoon was made by the Birmingham silversmith and *toy maker John Taylor, who specialised in small pieces and objects of vertu. The leaf-shaped bowl bright-etched around a veined centre. The end with a very pretty tendril loop handle. Leaf-shape caddy spoons are very collectable and this is a wonderful example by a renowned silversmith. * from the late 18th to early 19th Century, Birmingham was the centre for the making of "toys": small decorative objects from silver. They were produced in small family businesses and factories throughout Birmingham. They made a range of items including patch boxes, nutmeg graters, buckles, caddy spoons, vinaigrettes, snuff boxes and babies rattles. Hallmarks: IT for Joseph Taylor. Birmingham Assay Mark.
